## The Future of Groombridge **Post Office**



The Postmistress of Groombridge Post Office on Station Road, Groombridge, is retiring in September 2020 after many years of serving our parish.

With her retirement the Post Office will close unless the Parish Council steps in. Find out more about what the Parish Council is considering and how this would affect you.

Previously the Parish Council worked closely with History Groombridge's Premier Stores, to secure a post office counter there. However despite all efforts, this was not viable. Without another suitable business to take on the post office provision, the parish will no longer have a post office. This would result in the loss of not just local postal services but also other services such as banking, car tax, insurance and currency, and would impact local businesses.

**What Have We Done So far?** 

We are setting up a Community Interest Company in order to make

an application to Post Office Ltd. We needed to know whether a post office was required in the parish so we conducted a survey.

**Survey Results** 

Full results of the consultation are available on the Parish Council website. Comments showed that many of our residents (including our local businesses, the self-employed, those working from home and the elderly) rely on Groombridge Post Office with its easy access and parking. They also value the accessibility of the other shops and services around the hub of the post office. Thank you to all who responded.

98.9% of responders said YES they would support Withyham Parish Council in its efforts to secure the future of Groombridge Post Office



94.8% of responders from the Parish said YES they would support their council tax being used to secure and staff the post office



62 residents said they would be pleased to join a working group to explore the options for retaining a post office and/or would volunteer to work on the retail side of the post office. We thank everyone for their input and offers of support.

Having gauged support, Withyham Parish Council has been exploring where a post office service could be **Options** 'housed', as the current premises form part of the Postmistress' home. OPTION 1: to purchase the existing post office building to enable the post office to continue operating from the same site. OPTION 2: to convert part of the Old Station, Groombridge (130 yards up the road). Parish councils can access Public Works Loans at preferential rates to borrow for capital costs. A detailed Update and Options paper is available on our website and directly from the Parish Office, in addition to this Bulletin briefing, as it is important to the Parish Council to keep residents informed.

#### Council Tax/Precept

Due to the nature of the contract offered by Post

Office Ltd and additional costs of purchasing the current Post Office building/relocating it to the Parish Office, there would be an effect on the portion of Council tax that residents pay to the Parish Council (Precept). WPC will be carefully exploring the site options, as well as staffing and volunteer models, to clarify likely costs and impact on budgets. Current estimates based on the options are:

Minimum annual subsidy £25,943 which equates to £19.75 per year/38p per week extra in residents' Council Tax based on a Band D property

Maximum annual subsidy £47,387 which equates to £36.08 per year/69p per week extra in residents' Council Tax based on a Band D property

Welcome to our Bulletin update. Early on in lockdown, Withyham Parish Council wrote to all households in the parish that had not received a flyer from their local COVID-19 volunteers. 
