Join us to explore the wildlife in Groombridge!

Help us build a picture of the wild plants, birds, trees, insects, mammals, fish and fungi around us, find the richest habitats, and see how well our biodiversity is thriving.

Birds of Park Corner Pond, Groombridge – these are the birds you are most likely to see (or hear) in and around the pond area. Identify them using one of the birdsong identification apps – BirdNET or Merlin are brilliant!

Four of these birds are nesting nearby (May/Sept) - see if you can guess which ones – answer at the end.

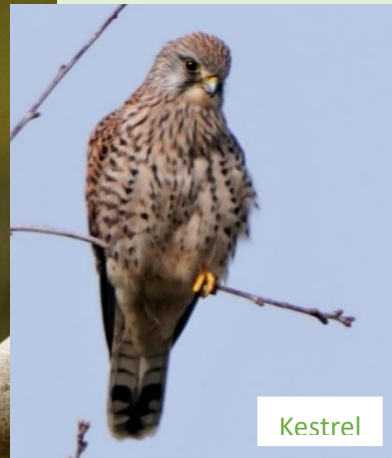
Collared Dove

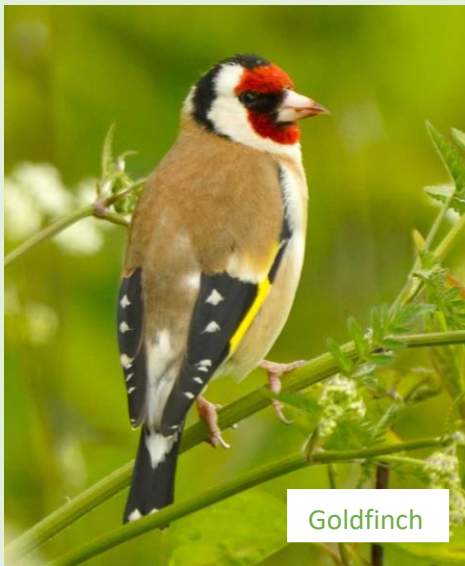

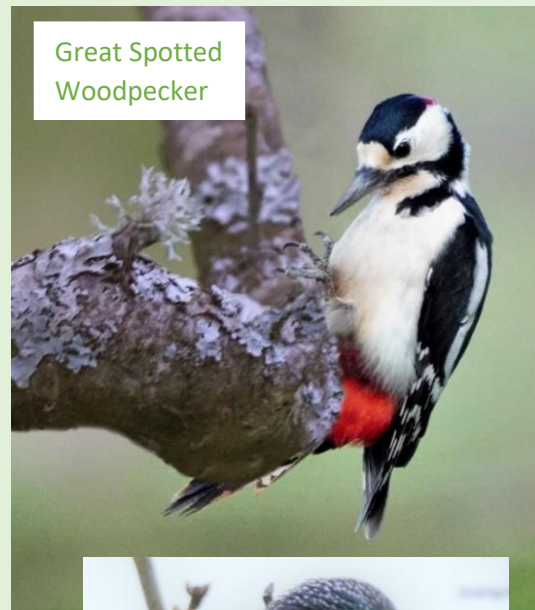


Kestrel

Birds to look out for — these birds we haven't yet seen in the pond area but are expected.



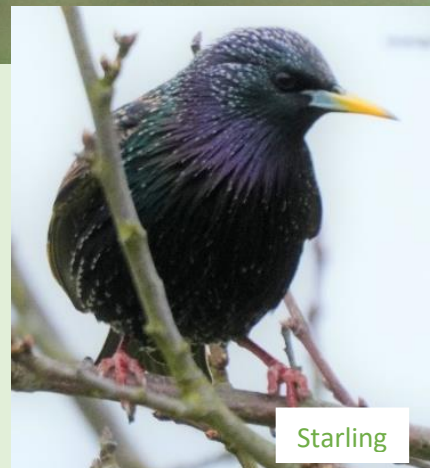
