It all began with a letter from the Cabinet Office to inform me that I was to be recommended to His Majesty the King, for the honour of Medal of the Order of the British Empire in the 2023 New Years Honours List. I naturally assumed this was a scam and rang the given telephone number to check – but it was true!

How had this come about? It seems, I had been secretly nominated for consideration by the King and a number of people had written in support of the nomination for my work in the community. Thank you to all those involved in this top secret operation, I had no idea at all. To be chosen by the King out of so many applications was both a shock and an incredible Honour. Wow – what an accolade. Many events in the process followed, culminating in attending a Royal

Garden party in the week leading up to the Kings Coronation, with both the King, Queen Consort Camilla and other senior royals in attendance. The gardens of Buckingham Palace are magnificent and it was wonderful to be able to meet other honour recipients and hear their stories. This was later followed by my Investiture in the grand surroundings of Lewes Town Hall. I felt so proud that my family and friends could witness this investiture and celebrate with me.

Did you know, the British Empire Medal (BEM) was established 4 June 1917 by King George V? It is awarded for a 'hands on service to the local community' for voluntary work and innovative service that has made a difference.

I would also like to thank Lord Abergavenny for his citation, which was very detailed and personal and the Lord Lieutenant of East Sussex for bestowing my medal. But above all I thank the team in the parish office for their support, and my lovely husband and family for their years of encouragement. Working with all of you in the community and the kind words from colleagues who nominated me, have meant so much. So many others in our parish deserve this recognition which makes me feel even more appreciative.

- Working with the police and residents to reduce levels of crime.
- Encouraging people to visit the parish and enjoy, with us, the beautiful villages, hamlets, and open spaces in our countryside which in turn can bring economic benefits to local businesses.

#### **Our Committees**

#### **Council Meetings**

Full Council meetings are held on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Monday of each month (except in August). Discussions and decisions are made on agenda items at these meetings and they are the driving force behind the actions of the Council.

### **Planning Committee**

Did you know that Withyham Parish Council is a Planning Consultee for applications within our boundary? We would always recommend submitting your comments to Wealden District Council who are the Planning Authority, but do feel free to also come along to our meetings to share your views.

#### Finance Committee

The Finance Committee administers all financial, health and safety and non-staff related contractual matters arising within the Council. These meetings also guide the actions of the Council.

#### Rights of Way Committee

This is an Advisory Committee tasked with monitoring the Rights of Way within our Parish in order to keep them open and accessible to all whilst liaising with East Sussex County Council Rights of Way team.

#### Climate & Ecological Advisory Group (CEAG)

Our newly formed Climate & Ecological Advisory Group look at the actions from the Parish Plan in combination with the results for the Parish from carbon calculating tools, to see what next steps can be recommended to Council.

The group is made up of Councillors and residents, and we have a few vacancies left, so if you would like to be part of the group or find out a bit more about what's happening contact the Parish Office.

#### WINTER RESILIENCE, BE PREPARED!

It always pays to be prepared for winter. There are some simple steps you can take to prepare yourself, your family, community, home or business.

You can do this by keeping informed, being ready at home, on the road and at work, and thinking of others in your community.

#### Consider having:

- a stock of non-perishable, easily prepared food that doesn't need cooking.
- some bottled water
- enough warm clothes lots of thinner layers are best - and bedding.
- LED torches or LED camping lanterns and spare batteries – much safer than candles.
- an old-fashioned plug-in, landline phone and a list of family members' landline numbers if they still have them.
- your car winter road ready and carry an emergency kit.

Keep a note of helpful contact numbers to hand such as:

- Water Company
- Electric and Gas Company
- Telephone provider
- Døctor and Pharmacy

If you are classed as vulnerable make sure you are registered with each of the above so you can receive priority in an emergency.

### Withyham Parish Council Climate and Ecology Advisory Group's

focus is on addressing, and where possible, responding to environmental and ecological concerns within the Parish.



The Impact Community Carbon Calculator Tool was used to create a detailed carbon calculator result for the whole Parish as a starting point. The report is available to view on the Parish Council website.

An important part of the group's aims is making informed recommendations to the Parish Council on environmental policies and practices that can benefit the community. Recently, Council supported the recommendation to purchase a handheld thermal imaging camera. This can be used by residents to carry out their own survey to indicate areas of heat loss in their homes. Contact the Parish Office to register your interest in borrowing this!

Community engagement is one of the corner stones of this working group, creating projects to benefit the community. In addition they will also be highlighting the work of, and partnering with, existing groups in the community who are addressing climate and nature issues.
